SDG 4: Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all




In Guyana, Sister Mary Peter Ngui has asked by the government of Guyana to work on a Math curriculum as part of the Quality Bilingual Education Programme for Wapichan children. These people live in the deep south of Guyana’s interior, close to the border with Brazil. Sr. Mary Peter writes: ...”the Ministry’s instructions were quite unhelpful. I was tasked with refashioning the whole math programme. The team has produced a set of Reading books consisting

of stories from their own folk lore together with Wapichan songs and games to go along with them.”

LAUDATO SI FOR THE CLASSROOM When Laudato Si impacted Sister Anne in a strong personal way, she began to think of ways to share this encyclical with young people. Her ideas that many young people have not heard of this document were further validated by the Global Catholic Climate Movement (GCCM) and the workshop for JPIC Coordinators (Rome). Thus, Sister Anne began working on a booklet that attempts to open up some of the key ideas in Laudato Si for a youth audience. With encouragement from her General Council and the JPIC Promoters in Rome she has produced and full package of creative resources for classroom use. Sr. Anne has already visited seven Manchester/Shrewsbury primary schools with the intention of opening up Laudato Si to teachers and students. All seven head teachers responded positively to the idea of a teacher



in-service evening, some opting to gather as part of a cluster group of schools and two of the larger schools opting for a session with their own individual teaching staffs.
